THIS SUNDAY'S GOSPEL: Jn 9: Excerpt

As Jesus passed by he saw a man blind from birth. His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" Jesus answered, "Neither he nor his parents sinned; it is so that the works of God might be made visible through him. We have to do the works of the one who sent me while it is day. Night is coming when no one can work. While I am in the world, I am the light of the world." When he had said this, he spat on the ground and made clay with the saliva, and smeared the clay on his eyes, and said to him, "Go wash in the Pool of Siloam" —which means Sent—. So he went and washed, and came back able to see.

Such a reading. Such dissent from the Pharisees who were blind and they remind us how closeminded we are in our human nature. We always know best. We have to be told twice or three times and we still don't believe. What about the clay and the spittle? We come from dust and contain particles of the Creation in us. The spittle reminds us of Mom's special cleaning solution from our childhood that could remove anything from our face. "**Be the light**" is our school theme this year. Jesus lives on in us for we are the LIGHT. We tell his story. We follow Him. Come hear the rest of the story at Mass this weekend. The old excuse "I don't go to Church. It's full of hypocrites" reminds us there is always room for one more." Be the light!

<u>Sunday is also the Feast of St. Joseph</u>. What a guy! He wasn't the first man to raise someone else's child and won't be the last. He was kind of invisible in Scripture except for responding to dreams, losing a kid, and being a tradesman to probably make Jesus lower to middle class. Joseph is so much like us and such a great model. Patron of fathers. Patron or workers. St. Joseph, pray for us!
