



At this time of year Theologians and Scripture Scholars remind us of the "Bible of Nature" which preceded the words written down in the Bible. *"Ever since God created the world, God's everlasting power and divinity—however invisible—are there for the mind to see in the things that God has made"* (Romans 1:20). The written words of the Bible allow for interpretation which is as varied as the imagination of human creatures. Authorship is traditionally attributed to Moses, following the exodus of Israel from Egypt, around 1400 BCE but most modern scholars accept that Genesis is a redacted literary work, reaching its final version as late as post-exilic Israel around 400 BCE. Regardless of your Bible, pay attention and enjoy God's creation.
