IF YOU CAN'T GO TO HAITI, THE NEXT BEST EXPERIENCE IS TO TALK TO SOMEONE WHO LIVES THERE. Photo courtesy of Jai Lavington

On Monday, November 4th, Fr. Delix Michel of the Diocese of Gonaives in Haiti spoke to the Gibault students and staff. Fr. Michel is founding pastor of Our Lady of Assumption Parish in that Diocese. He has a Doctorate in Sacred Scripture from Rome, served 19 years in the Springfield Illinois Diocese, is a United States citizen, has been a priest for 36 years, and has the unique perspective to know how

we think and how the current conditions in his home country and parish cry out for our prayers and support.

He opened his talk by asking students to *"become what you want to be, because in Haiti we can't."* Haiti is 794 miles from the United States and was the second independent country in the Western Hemisphere in 1803 after revolting from France. He reminded the students of the curse of slavery, that the Atlantic Ocean is the largest graveyard in the world due to slaves either dying on board or being thrown overboard, dismantling of tribes by language for plantation control and the development of the Creole language as a direct form of resistance. Spain negotiated a peace with a payment to France of 150 million francs which later grew to billions that was eventually repaid by 1942 but bankrupted the country.

Haiti today has 11.4 million people and 5.6 million are food deprived. Life expectancy for women is 53 and men 51. There is no potable water for 90% of the country.

Three years ago, the President of the country and his wife were assassinated after calls to police and the embassies brought no response. Gangs now rule the country. The poor are the first victims. Schools are not in session in most areas, Church life is disturbed, and a hospital run by St. Theresa of Kolkutta's Missionaries of Charity was looted just a few weeks ago.

United States programs that saved thousands of Haitians by immigration created chaos in the US and depleted the country of their best resource—educated people. US help in eliminating the gang cells is the solution. Currently, the United Nations has brought in Kenyan help for the police, but the connection has not been made. When the police make \$250 per month while a gang member makes \$5000, corruption is everywhere with the gang cells controlling the sites of power.

Student questions covered the areas of earthquake recovery which has not happened despite billions raised in the United States; governance which relies on a 7 member council with a rotating president that is totally ineffective against the gang cells; his interest in the priesthood which came at age 9 from his French pastor and serving as an Altar Boy before receiving his First Communion; gang control which has been suppressed in some areas with the people killing the gang leaders; inflation which has been driven up by lack of goods and constant gang theft; and lack of a US effort to clean up the gangs which he feels could be done within 3 months.

Fr. Michel concluded by asking for prayers for him and his country, that we be messengers of the hope and joy of the Gospels despite our life situations and then gave us his blessing.

"But of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father."
